Did you know?



Research states that mental health issues affect about 1 in 10 children. The emotional wellbeing of children is just as important as their physical health. Good mental health allows young people to develop resilience, cope with the ups and downs in life and grow into healthy adults.

Surveys suggest that most young people are mentally healthy but more children are having problems due to life changes, traumatic events, feeling vulnerable or not coping with difficult situations. The Guardian has recently published that tens of thousands of young people in Britain are struggling with their mental health and are seeking help online for problems.

Research indicates that common mental health problems for young people include depression, self-harm, eating disorders, post-traumatic stress disorder, anxiety and panic attacks. Poor mental health in childhood affects educational attainment, increases the likelihood of smoking, alcohol and drug use, and has consequences for poorer physical health in later life.



What can you do?

Take time to do some research about mental health issues and symptoms with young people. Point your child towards websites or helplines that can give them information as well. Here are some useful websites to get you started:

www.mind.org.uk www.youngminds.org.uk

Seek further advice from a professional if you are worried or concerned about your child.

Talk to your child about any worries they have, be supportive and show empathy and understanding. Try to avoid persistent questioning but encourage them to open up to you and reassure them that you are there to help them. Try to make your child feel loved, trusted and safe.

Don't blame yourself for any problems your child is having as this will not help the situation. Be honest and explain that you are worried and help them access the right kind of help. Encourage your child to take up healthy habits to help them to maintain a positive state of mental health. Examples are:

- Healthy eating
- Good sleep routine
- Seeing friends and connecting with others
- Taking time out to relax
- Exercising
- Doing hobbies
- Spend time outdoors

Spring has sprung!

It has been a very busy and exciting week with year 7's working hard, enjoying the sunshine, engaging in after school PE events, Grease rehearsals and having the added excitement of an end of year trip to look forward to.

Our highest achiever this week is **Katy Rollings**. Congratulations Katy, you have clearly been working super hard this week. Well done.

Attendance this week has been better. Our attendance in year 7 was 95% this week. Please can you send a paracetamol in with your child, should they need one during the day or be available to come in to give, and we will, as always, support where needed. If your child has to have time off school, please ensure that you call the absence line on 01553 602874 or call the main reception and select option 1 to explain why. If we send you a text message and you are unable to respond, please send a note in with your child when they return to school explaining why they have been away. Please can I ask that if you do text my work phone or email me directly with absences, please contact the attendance officer too as I cannot guarantee that I will always see the messages.

With the weather warming up, I would just like to remind you all again of our academy's expectations regarding uniform. Black tailored trousers or KLA skirts, no jeans or leggings, black tailored shorts are acceptable in the nicer weather, white shirts, KLA tie and blazer. If your child chooses to wear a KLA jumper, please remember that blazers must also be worn. Nicer weather doesn't mean blazers are not needed. Jumpers must be off and blazers on every day. KLA jumpers are optional, blazers are not. If you do have any issues with your child's uniform or if you need any help purchasing items, please do not hesitate to contact me as we have some uniform in the swap shop which may help. Fluffy coloured socks are not permitted as uniform and acrylic nails are also not allowed for school. They are dangerous when taking part in practical subjects. Please can we ask that they are not worn for school. In addition to this, it is vital that all students bring their full PE kits with them on the days they have it. Students should not still need to be borrowing kit, nor should they need to borrow equipment. A pencil case is a daily essential in school however I am still having to lend them to students daily. Please can you ensure you child is fully equipped each day and ready to learn.



We have seen a number of water pistols being brought into school. For obvious reasons, these are NOT ALLOWED and if they are seen, they WILL be confiscated and thrown away. I have made this very clear in my assemblies and have stressed this again today.

I would also like to mention fidget toys. We have 5 approved fidget toys that are allowed in school, as advised by our SENCO, Miss Hills. Despite this being raised in assembly several weeks ago, I am still seeing a high number of random fidgets being used by my students. Magnetic balls, squish ball, characters, shapes etc, keyboard key buttons, stretchy toys, you name it, I've seen it. I have said I will confiscate if I see anymore. They are not allowed in school so please ensure you provide your child with one of the correct fidgets from our approved list.

Just a reminder for when they return on Monday:

Uniform - The actual uniform list direct from our website is as follows:

Uniform specifications:

- **Black trousers** in a traditional style (not permitted: cords, jeans, wide flares or skinny designs)
- **Black knee length KLA pleated skirt** (available from [Stratfords](#)) worn with black socks or tights
- **Tailored black shorts**
- **Plain white shirt with a collar**
- **Black blazer with the academy logo embroidered on the breast pocket** (available from [Stratfords](#))
- **An academy tie** (available from [Stratfords](#))
- **Jumper with academy logo – optional** (available from [Stratfords](#))
- **Black formal shoes** (not permitted: trainers, canvas shoes or shoes with sports logos)

Please note, the jumper is optional, however the **blazer is compulsory**. Students not following the rules will be sanctioned with detentions, either break, lunch or after school. These are very simple rules which need to be followed and will need to be adhered to for entrance into the GCSE exams hall.

Also, for your information, **leggings are not accepted as trousers**.

Hoodies are not permitted in school and students will be asked to remove them as soon as they enter school.

Phones are not allowed in school. If seen, they will be confiscated and will be returned to the student on the 1st occasion; however, after that they will need to be collected by parents/guardians.

Attendance:

In line with our attendance policy, we will complete a home visit on day 3 of absence. This is something completed for every student who is absent for 3 days. Please do not think this is to be intrusive. It is not because we do not trust your judgement. Home visits are conducted for safeguarding, welfare checks, and to address barriers to attendance, in accordance with the government's guidelines.

If you cannot book appointments outside of school hours (which now we are getting to exam season would be the best possible option please, see timetable below) we will need to see proof of the appointment for it to be logged as an authorised medical appointment, rather than unauthorised absence.

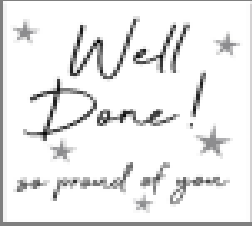
